Workshop A: PCL-R Training
The Psychopathy Checklist Revised (PCL-R) provides a standard methodology for assessing Psychopathy. This training workshop, provided by Dr. Stephen Hart (Simon Fraser University) , will review the content of this methodology and its administration.
Session A: Sexual Deviance
Presenter: <i>Dr. Peter Collins, Coordinator, Forensic Psychiatry Unit of the Behavioural Sciences and Analysis Services (Ontario Provincial Police) and Associate Professor at the University of Toronto,</i> will present on the topic of paraphilic (sexually deviant) behaviour.
Session B: Relationship Terrorism
Presenter: <i>Dave Franklin (retired RCMP)</i> will be speaking about relationships where violence forms a component. Mr. Franklin uses a comparative analysis between the Battered Woman Syndrome and the Stockholm Syndrome of hostage situations.
Session C: Patriarch / Honour Based Violence
Presenter: <i>Dr. Henrik Belfrage, Mid Sweden University and Sundsvall Forensic Psychiatric Centre</i> will be speaking about <i>The PATRIARCH</i> , a risk assessment tool for use in cases involving suspected honour related violence. <i>The PATRIARCH</i> has been used in Sweden since 2005 by the Swedish police and other agencies.
Session D: Terrorist Pre-Incident Indicators
Presenter: <i>Sgt Dustin Rusk, RCMP</i> will discuss threat assessment and risk management in relation to acts of terrorism and political violence.
Session E: Implementing Threat Assessment on Campus
Presenters: <i>Dr. Gene Deisinger / Emily Reineke</i> will review the process of setting up a Threat Assessment Team after the trauma of the Virginia Tech Shooting.
Session F: European Threat Management Case Studies
Presenters: <i>Bram van der Meer, Netherlands Police Agency (Behavioural Analysis Unit) and Totti Karpela, Peace of Mind Training Services (Finland)</i> will present case studies on Domestic Violence and Workplace Violence.
Session G: Public Figure Stalking
Presenter: <i>Dr. Meloy, University of California, San Diego, School of Medicine</i> will present findings on public figure stalking from his research work in the US, UK, and Europe. The focus will be on key concepts including a typology of warning behaviours, grandiosity, entitled reciprocity, motivations, pathway analysis, and mental disorders.
Session H: Dangerous Offenders
Presenters: <i>Dr. Choy, Alberta Hospital and Dr. Ennis, Forensic Behavioural Science Group</i> will review the relevance of two major domains of risk, sexual deviance and antisociality, through case examples which were subject to assessments under Dangerous Offender and Long-term Offender legislation in Canada.
Session I: Threats to Justice Officials
Presenter: <i>Matt Crone, Ministry of the Attorney General</i> will review case studies of threat assessment and risk management in relation to justice officials.
Session J: Fort Hood Incidents & TA Teams
Presenter: <i>Dorian Van Horn, Supervisory Special Agent, US Naval Criminal Investigative Services</i> will review the Fort Hood army base shooting and discuss the process and issues associated to setting up Threat Assessment Teams.
